Running into several issues when installing Radicore on the godaddy.com hosting service.

Not sure if there are work arounds for these, but thought I should ask before I get too deep.

- 1) The MySQL implementation 5.0.91-log, via phpadmin web admin interface, wont allow the creation of databases with names like menu, or dict or audit, etc. It would seem that their database names are global and therefore must be unique across their customer's domain (absurd). Will Radicore work if I'm forced to rename the Radicore internal database? Names like, radicore_menu, for the menu database, or something similar?
- 2) The hosting site's implementation of PHP won't allow the directives php_value 'assignment'. Will a php5.ini file, set to the appropriate values work instead?
