When a \$where string includes multibyte characters such as Chinese, sometimes you will notice that the \$where clause is not interpreted correctly.

This problem can traced back to the operation\$where = trim(preg_replace("\s+/", " ", \$where)); // replace tabs and newlines with ' 'in function where2indexedArray (\$where) in file include.library.inc.

Turns out that the /s criteria of the regex applies also to individual bytes of multibyte characters and when such a single byte meets /s criteria it would then be replaced with a "space byte", changing the multibyte character into something else. I solved this problem by adding the /u modifier to the regex: $= trim(preg_replace("/s+/u", "", $where)); // replace tabs and newlines with ''$
