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I defined this calculated field in a relationship:

CONCAT\_WS(',',participante.catsalut, participante.nombre, participante.apellido1,participante.apellido2) AS part\_det

when I saved it it was automatically transformed to: CONCAT\_WS(\',\',participante.catsalut, participante.nombre, participante.apellido1,participante.apellido2) AS part\_det

So when running the application I got this error:

I have tried this on my system and I cannot get it to fail. When I use a CONCAT expression in a relationship the single quotes are not escaped on the screen. You can see for yourself in the demonstration system by going to Home->Dictionary->Databases, select 'Xample', press 'Tables', select 'x\_person', press 'Relationships (table)' followed by 'select all' and 'Read'.

Each single quote is escaped just once when it is exported to the .dict.inc file, so the resulting sql satement is perfectly valid.

I assume you are using the latest version of Radicore?

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Have you got magic guotes turned ON in your PHP configuration? This should be turned OFF in the htaccess file.

When you define the CONCAT statement in the relationship details are you including a backslash in front of each single quote? If so then you should not as the quotes will be escaped in the framework code.
