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I have investigated this problem, and I can confirm that UTF8 characters in any of the language\_text.inc files will be displayed properly provided that you save the file as UTF8 and not ASCII or something like Windows 1252.

I have tested this by putting some UTF8 characters into one of my standard text files, then loading that message into the screen. The attached screen shot shows the difference between saving the file as UTF8 and non-UTF8.
